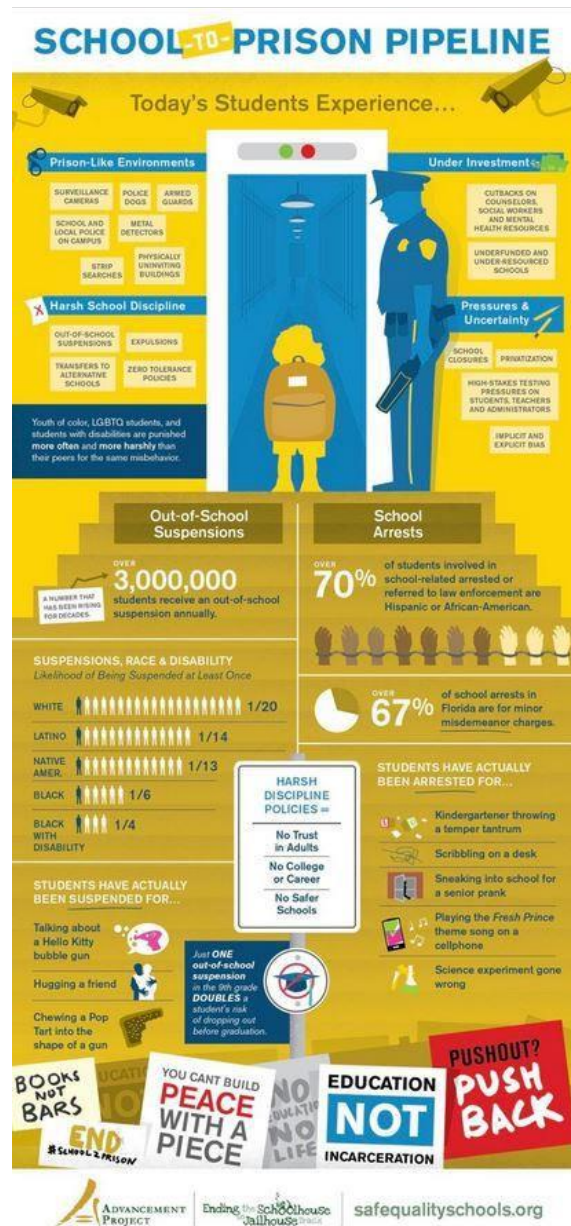

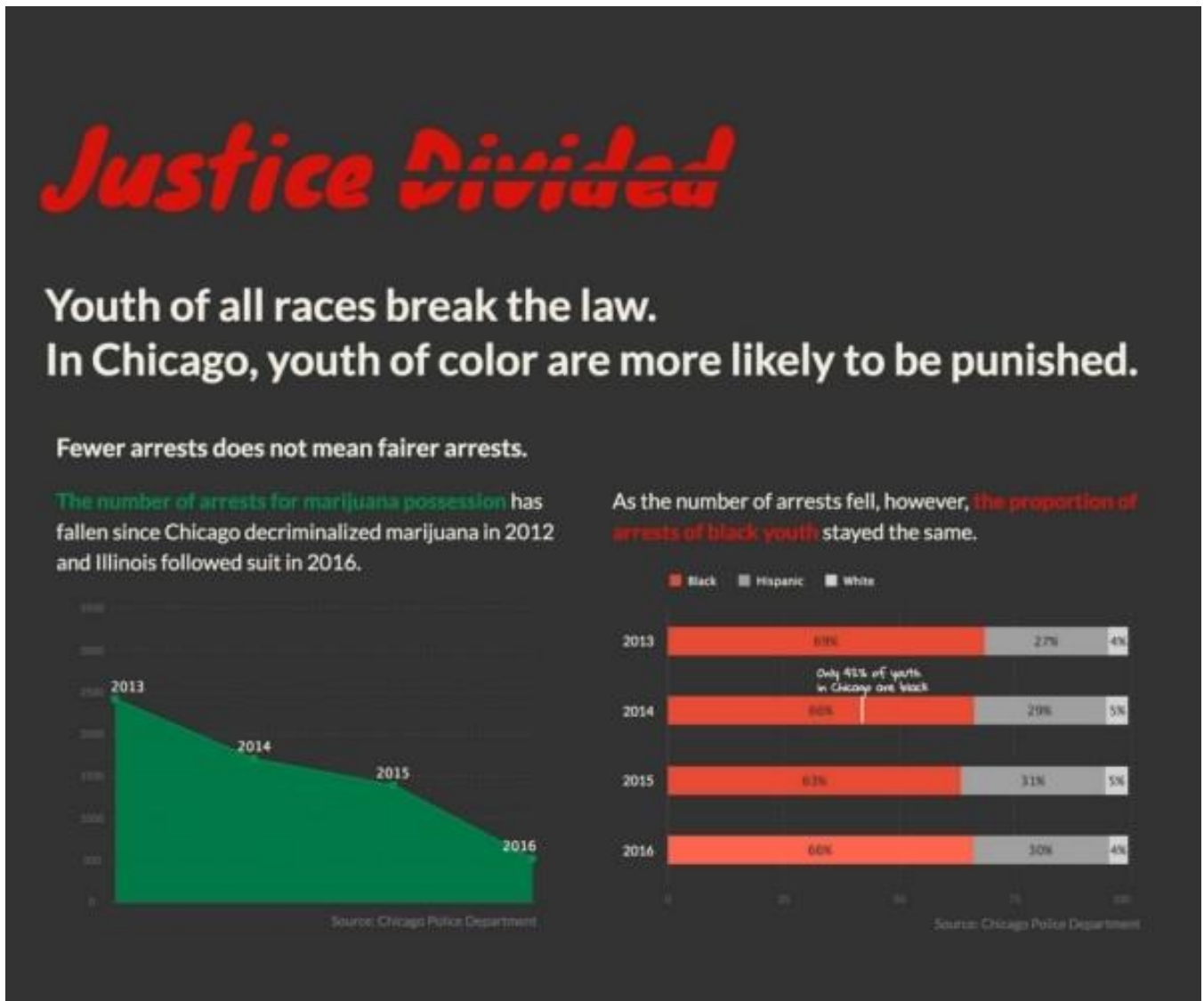

Black students are **3-4 times** more likely than their white peers to be expelled or face multiple suspensions from school.

White

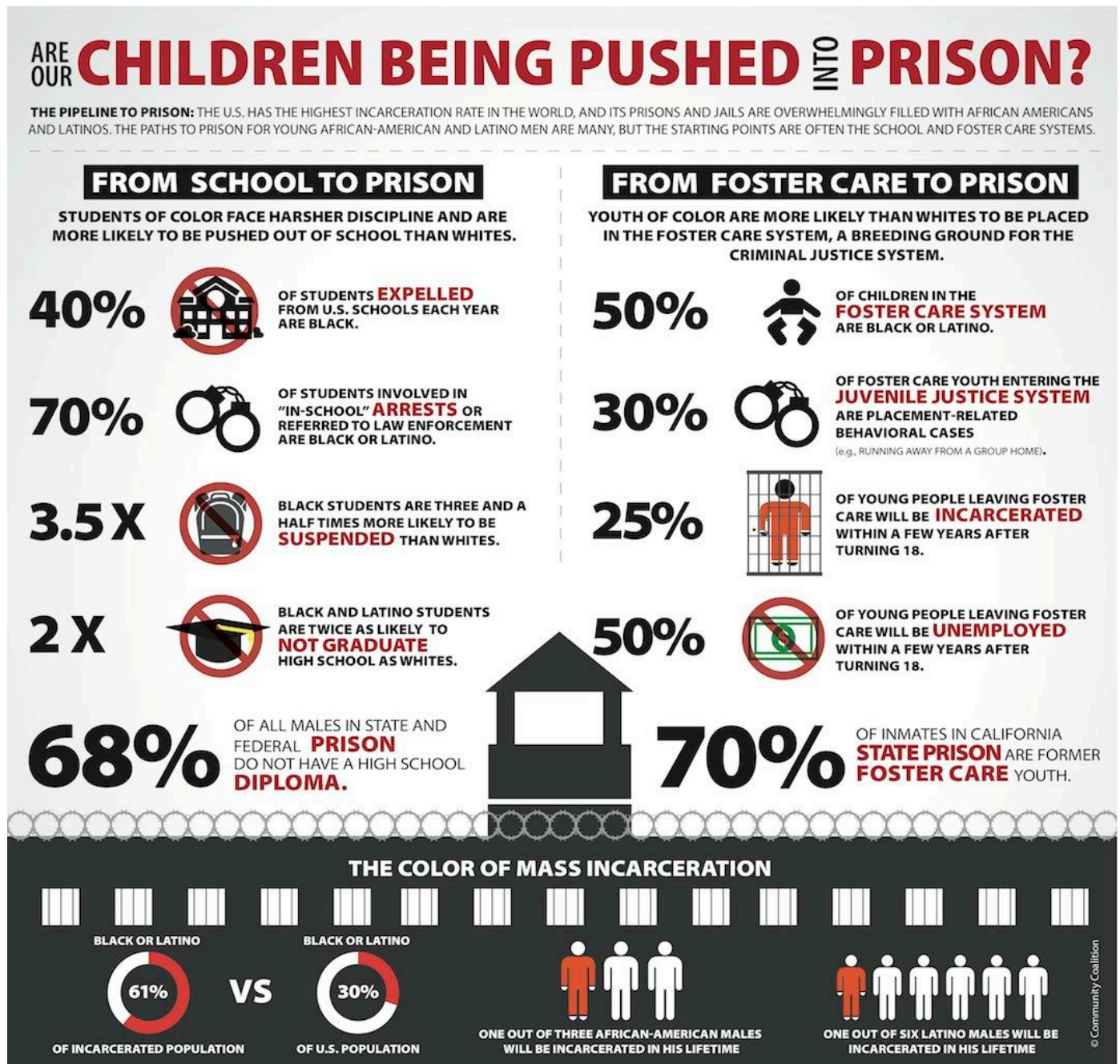
Risk of Facing Multiple Suspensions

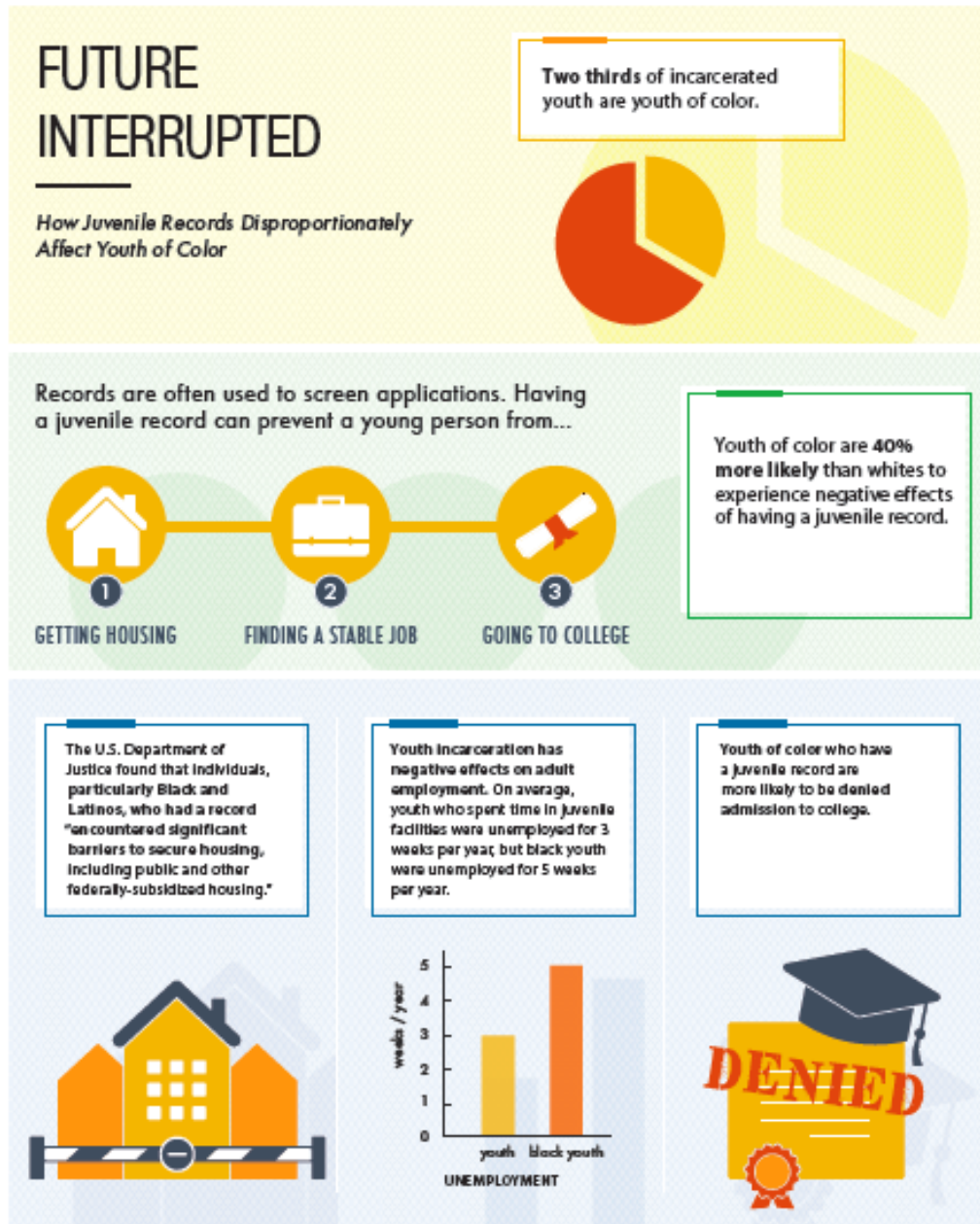

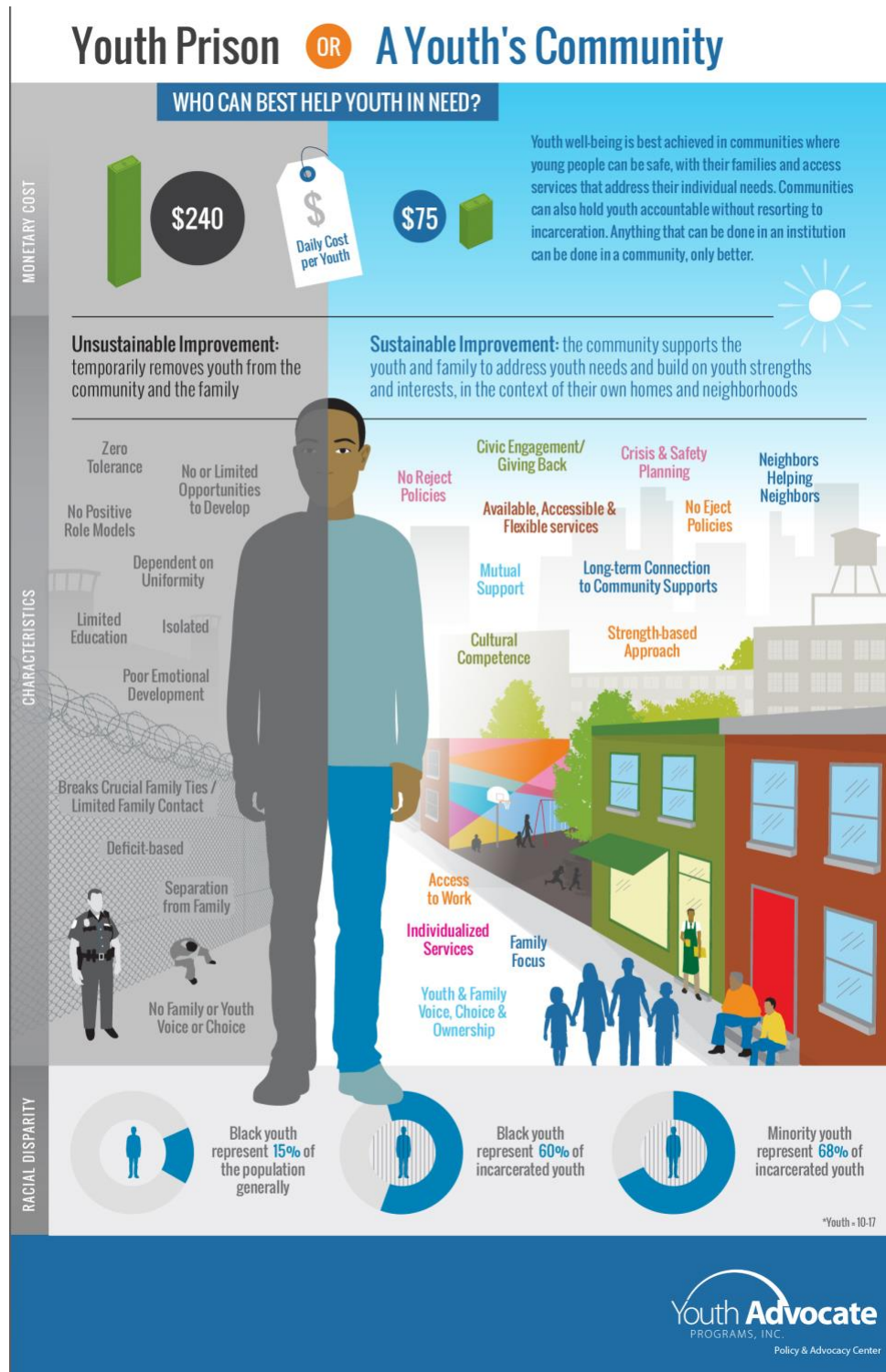
